<b>I. Consent Agenda</b> <b>a. Previous CAP meeting minutes</b> <b>b. 2023 Quality Incentive Measure (QIM) Performance</b>	On a motion made by Mimi McDonell and seconded by Colin Taggart, the CAP unanimously approved the Consent Agenda.
<b>II. CGHC Board Report</b>	The Board approved the CAC funding for Social Determinants of Health & Equity grants. The Board will make a decision on CAP approved funding at a future meeting. The Board also reviewed the Coordinated Care Organization budget for 2024.
<b>III. CAC Report</b>	The CAC approved funding for Social Determinants of Health & Equity grants which were approved by the Board. The CAC is working to recruit new members. One challenge facing the CAC is providing interpretation to Spanish-speaking members on Zoom meetings.
<b>IV. NEW AGENDA ITEM: CAP CO-CHAIR</b>	Shannon O’Brien has offered to serve as the Behavioral Health CAP Co-Chair taking Brooke Nicholls position who was serving as interim Co-Chair until a Behavioral Health representative was identified.  On a motion made by Mimi McDonell and seconded by Trish Elliott, the CAP unanimously approved Shannon O’Brien as the Behavioral Health CAP Co-Chair.
<b>V. Prevention Department update</b> <b>a. Youth Tobacco Cessation</b> <b>b. Mental Health First Aid</b>	Belinda Ballah provided updates aimed at improving community health outcomes through prevention strategies. Initiatives include addressing alcohol use and misuse, education on tobacco, marijuana, and suicide prevention, and mental health first aid training. Collaborative initiatives with Trish's department were discussed, focusing on opioid rescue kits and educational presentations. The office also uses therapy dogs in high schools to promote mental health and provides smoking cessation programs. Belinda highlighted community resources focused on suicide prevention and awareness, including support groups and health media clubs in schools.

<b>VI. Maternal Child Health workgroup</b>	Brooke Nicholls reported on the success of postpartum support groups held in Spanish, funded by a grant, and plans for two more groups in April and October. They also mentioned a breastfeeding and lactation education grant and the progress of the social emotional health metric project, which aimed to improve the social and emotional health of children aged 0 to 5. Brooke emphasized the need for improved lactation support at the primary care level and the importance of parenting programs. They also discussed the effectiveness of the Little Dinah curriculum and the need for more trained providers.
<b>VII. Social Emotional Health Metric update</b>	Gaby Swisher provided an update on the Incredible Years, Little Dinah training. The group discussed the effectiveness of the training and plans for using the remaining \$57,000 on more primary care provider and parent training.
<b>VIII. PacificSource updates</b> <b>a. QIM report</b>	Amy Solmonson provided an update on data through October, expressing concerns about child visits and childhood immunizations metrics. Amy discussed challenges with vaccine access, coding issues, and changes in vaccine purchasing that may impact the availability of providers offering all childhood immunizations
<b>IX. Year in review/Next year planning activity</b>	The CAP reflected on the year, highlighting the expansion of behavioral health services, improved representation from MCMC (Adventist Health) and a record number of applications for CAP projects, indicating a significant reach across various organizations. The group discussed the need to increase focus on substance use in the coming year and explore collaborations with the Recovery Center and the Peer Collaborative
