<b>Announcements</b>	Joel Pelayo has graciously accepted the role of the Vice-Chair.  Ellen stated that services were continuing to be offered in the same manner at the health department as in the past with regards to immigration status.
<b>Approve January CAC meeting minutes</b>	Minutes were approved. ★ Suzanne will make an edit to the December meeting to make sure that Karen Polehn gets counted as being there.
<b>Recent CGHC Board meeting topics</b>	Ellen reviewed the recent Board agenda and the Board's discussion of how decisions would be made for community investment towards Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) topics.
<b>Announcement of Flexible Services</b>	Trudy Townsend announced PacificSource has flexible services. These are services that would improve someone's health status but aren't necessarily a health benefit. Jack shared that he benefitted from flexible services and he is grateful. Trudy shared that there will be an evaluation of the services and she will share this with the CAC. A question was asked about how people would know to ask about eligibility. Trudy explained that the outreach will be done to the providers. She will come back to review the process and forms with the CAC including the templates for denials on covered benefits and flexible services.

<b>MARC Grant update</b>	<p>Claire Ranit and Molly Rogers spoke about Trauma-Informed practices. They reviewed specifics about the Sanctuary Model and chose it because it involves safety and recovery. Currently, the 2-day training model through the Mobilizing Action for Resilient Communities (MARC) grant is being used to bring Sanctuary training specifically targeting healthcare and the justice system. The group was asked how the MARC grant work could support the CHIP process. Karen shared that reframing how challenges in mental health are viewed could be helpful. She also spoke about the disconnection of young adults to the community. Gladys would recommend referral information be provided for those who are responding to trauma questions positively. This request led to the discussion about warm handoffs.</p>
<b>Gather candidate themes from CAC</b>	<p>Coco reviewed the current CHIP topics as well as potential additional new candidate topics. The discussion highlighted multiple items for the CAC:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There were several different suggestions on how to categorize or group the existing CHIP topics.</li> <li>• Each CHIP topic had a different scope making it difficult to discuss prioritization.</li> <li>• Some participants wanted to understand how the recent Community Health Assessment (CHA) information could be used.</li> </ul> <p>★ Coco will incorporate the various feedback items for the meeting in March.</p>
