Clinical Advisory Panel (CAP) Meeting Minutes

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Agenda Item	Duration, Presenter, and CAP Action Required
<p>Welcome & Introductions & Announcements</p>	<p>Coco Yackley reminded everyone the Community Health Survey has been mailed and encouraged the CAP to get the word out for recipients to complete the survey.</p> <p>Beth Foster suggested the CAP doing a broad community presentation on some of the data being discussed and inviting community representatives. The CAP supported the idea.</p> <p>Trish Elliot announced that Hood River County Health Department (HRCHD) will be offering Living Well classes in both English and Spanish. It is a class to teach self-management skills for chronic diseases.</p>
<p>Additions and Deletions Conflicts of Interest Non Agenda items</p>	<p>Judy Richardson, MD requested a future discussion about a provider share of the Quality Incentive Measure (QIM) dollars and she advocated for the continuation of the money to come back to providers to continue the work on improved care processes. The CAP decision was to first learn how the 2013 & 2014 QIM money was spent. This information will be collected and the discussion will be tabled for the August and/or September CAP.</p>
<p>Approval of May Minutes</p>	<p>On a motion made and seconded, the CAP unanimously approved the May minutes.</p>
<p>Recent CGHC Board agenda</p>	<p>The recent CGCH Board agenda topics were reviewed.</p>
<p>PacificSource Updates</p>	<p>Quality Health & Outcome Committee (QHOC): Alison Little, MD reviewed the QHOC meeting material.</p> <p>Alison announced that the Columbia Gorge Coordinate Care Organization (CCO) has met all 17 QIM measures for 2015. Congrats to all.</p> <p>Doulas: Doulas are a covered service. The CAP discussed that doulas are being used in the Gorge but are not a service that is being billed for via insurance. There was optimism about using doulas and being able to bill for the service.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Robin Henson, MD agreed to follow up with Providence, Hood River doulas and Mary Alsup, clinic manager at Columbia River Women’s Center.
<p>Emergency Department (ED) Utilization Follow-up</p>	<p>Alison collected and presented more specific data related to ED usage in Mid-Columbia Medical Center (MCMC). Mark England presented the data collected from visits to MCMC. A request was made to include the reason for visit. There was discussion about 7 day infusion treatments and whether or not these were being counted as ED visits. Suggestions were made to narrow the data to the Oregon Health Plan (OHP) population. Beth suggested funding a study to gain more information on incoming ED patients.</p> <p>Questions for an upcoming meeting included: Who are non-urgent patients? What is the plan for the no-Primary Care Provider (PCP) group with follow up?</p>

Recommendation for Coverage of Back Pain/Spine Line	<p>Kristen Dillon, MD reviewed the Pain and Opiate Treatment Advisory (POTA) group report on low back pain treatment. She reviewed the stratified approach the POTA group took based on the STarT Back Screening Tool (SBST) categories. Four visits will be approved for everyone. More than 4 visits will require the SBST but it is highly recommended the SBST be used at the beginning of the treatment process.</p> <p>The CAP group asked for more information on how information will be disseminated regarding changes and the SBST. Childhood Immunizations update	<p>Kristen reviewed immunization data separated out by specific clinic. The data indicates a downward trend in meeting the requirement of having all children fully immunized by the age of 2. Recommendations were made to give all vaccines that could be given at a visit as well as doing 15 month visits.</p>
