Investment request follow-up from Board meeting	<p>Al reviewed the topics of the CGHC Board meeting and the fact that the meeting ran long. Al shared that the Board wanted to have a meaningful discussion on the three CAP topics and decided that was best achieved by postponing the discussion to the February Board meeting. Coco shared feedback from the Executive Committee members that the Sobering Center proposal include an overview of existing services and that proposals identify a connection with the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP).</p> <p>Mimi asked for some specifics about a funding amount and concerns about transparency around funding amount and source. The Board has not decided on a funding level which can be shared at this point. Al will carry the message to the Board the issue regarding the ambiguity in funding level.</p>
2017 & 2018 QIM Summary	<p>Elke reviewed the 100% payout performance of the Columbia Gorge Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) for 2017. Celebrate! She also presented the 2018 targets and changes and noted on the materials where the most challenging issues will be. These include Effective Contraceptive Use (ECU), timely Prenatal Care, Cigarette Smoking Prevalence, Depression Screening and Hypertension Control. Hypertension Control remains problematic since the measure is not following the most current evidence-based medicine.</p> <p>Ashley asked about the potential to help with Weight Assessment Quality Incentive Measure (QIM) in dental clinics at Women, Infants & Children (WIC) and the health department. Elke explained that the measurement is achieved through EMR reports and therefore limited to primary care providers.</p> <p>Brooke asked what the challenges are around Depression Screening. Coco shared that as performance targets get progressively harder, the region won't be able to pass the metric with only 1 or 2 organizations carrying the region. In the case of Depression Screening, with only 3 organizations participating in the metric, improving on the 'dark red' performance will be essential.</p>

	<p>Mimi asked if the CAP should get more detailed information around specification sheets (available on the OHA website). The CAP wanted continued sharing of knowledge amongst each other about how to be successful.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Elke to include the link to the OHA website with the detailed specification in future QIM reporting documents.
Pathways Update	<p>Suzanne and Katy presented an update about the Bridges to Health Pathways Program including an update on the contract signed between the Columbia Gorge Health Council (CGHC) and PacificSource to fund the program sustainably through Medicaid funds. Jodi Ready shared that having the CHW in Providence as part of the Bridges to Health program has not only benefited her clients but has contributed positively to her own job stress since she knows there is someone to work with a client outside of the clinic setting.</p>
Community Grant Proposal finalists	<p>Coco shared with the CAP that the recommended Community Grant proposals were approved by the CGHC Board for funding. Beth shared that the Board discussed at length the need for honoring integrity and being transparent with funding.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Coco will send out the list of the proposals that were funded.
Additional Announcements	<p>Susan shared that she proposed to PacificSource the use of flexible service funds to support Meals on Wheels for CCO clients to get support upon hospital discharge.</p> <p>Jodi shared that she spoke with Stefanie Wahab (the Motivational Interviewing instructor) and that she can be flexible in scheduling to help meet the needs of providers in terms of a Motivational Interviewing Introductory course and for booster sessions. Possibilities for timing were four 3-hour sessions in the Spring, Fall and then again next year.</p>
