Welcome & Introductions	Guests: Sarah Prates- Providence Pharmacist, Claire Ranit-CGHC, Paul Lindberg- Collective Impact Specialist,
Announcements	Kim Humann shared with the CAP that she will be stepping down towards the end of summer as she is taking a new position with GOBHI. Robin also announced that she is retiring from her profession. Robin expressed interested in staying on the CAP but isn't sure she is able to remain on the group.
Additions and Deletions Conflicts of Interest Non-Agenda items	The group discussed the passing away of Dr. Jim MacMillan and what a loss his passing is to the community. Kim expressed the need to continue to support MCCFL as they transition from this loss.
Consent Agenda <ul style="list-style-type: none">• June CAP Meeting minutes• Recent CGHC Board agenda• 2017 QIM Performance• Regional Quality Pool applications	CAP is shifting to a Consent Agenda format. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The expectation is that the Consent Agenda material is reviewed prior to the meeting.• Members will have a chance to pull out an item if they want more discussion on it prior to approving the Consent Agenda.• The CAP will be asked to approve the Consent Agenda at each meeting. On a motion made and seconded, the June CAP Consent Agenda was unanimously approved.
2017 QIM Performance Status	Elke reviewed the QIM performance thus far through the end of May. We are currently at the 60% mark which would leave over \$800K on the table. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mimi offered that the public health departments would be willing to help improve the status on ECU and Immunizations• Elke shared an opportunity to have Dr. Bakus come and do a CME for providers on medications and hypertension. She will poll the group in the future.• Diabetes care discussion led to dialog on potential increased use of nutritionists and integration of behaviorists in the care plan. Depression is a common amongst diabetics.
Approval for behavioral health integration site visits	Kristen shared that Primary Care Clinics can receive fee-for-service payments from PacificSource for some of the services of behavioral health clinicians. Clinics must use the IPAT tool to attest to their level of integration. However, site visits from independent contractors frequently found that the actual

	<p>operations were not as robust as indicated in the self-assessments. Kristen requested up to \$8K to fund an external consultant to conduct site reviews using the IPAT tool and provide feedback to the clinics regarding any deficiencies. On a motion made and seconded the CAP unanimously approved the funds to provide the necessary feedback. The CAP clarified that the site reviews would help identify deficiencies in performance to meeting the requirements to be able to bill for behavioral health services. Technical Assistance to address those deficiencies would come from Elke.</p>

The absence of a firm proposal by August may lower the priority on this funding. • Tobacco Cessation @ \$85K. Trish shared an updated proposal for tobacco cessation. Input from CAP is to expand scope to include youth. CAP continues to be interested in moving this forward for QIM funds. • Foster families & Foster children. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Al B. to arrange for MCCFL to present at Aug CAP on existing work planned for foster families supports. ○ Suzanne C. shared recent agreement to place a Bridges to Health Care Coordinator at DHS to work with DHS children. Sue J shared the importance of including the schools with the Bridges to Health DHS focused program to ensure that children get to remain in the schools they have been attending. CAP consensus for a proposal on small ‘incidentals for foster children’. • Substance Abuse workgroup. Now On Hold due to Kim Humann’s departure. No plans to bring a proposal forward. • Transitions of Care for Elders. Interest in the topic overall but many questions from group. CAP discussion suggested to keep working the proposal but not target the time-sensitive QIM funds. <p>Claire shared that there is a program called “Handle with Care” so that police can let schools know when a child has been involved in a traumatic experience.
